Change description to: Analysis of mediated communication patterns and their social importance; considers both news, public affairs, and entertainment influences. Emphasis may vary depending on instructor.

Change description to: This course provides an overview of public policy issues; the federal role in gaming regulation; the economics of gaming; the creation of gaming control systems; the licensing process; ethical requirements for the gaming lawyer; accounting, internal controls and taxation; gaming contracts; gaming crimes; advertising; entertainment; the legislative process; problem gambling; and practical approaches to legal representation.
